Cooking with Love

What most of us may call a chore, the Manna Cafe kitchen staff considers a labor of love. Rita Stinson, Manna's kitchen manager, and Katt Harris, lead cook, are the dynamic duo that orchestrate the preparation of delicious and nutritious meals for Manna Cafe guests.

Rita is a seasoned veteran of the food service industry. She owned and operated two restaurants in Kentucky before relocating to the Clarksville area. She began as a volunteer at Manna and after four months was named lead cook. In October of 2022 she became the kitchen manager. When asked why she chose to come to Manna, she immediately answers, "To give back. Here we can see how blessed we really are." Rita especially likes bringing clients into the Culinary Internship program. "We can help our interns to achieve something for themselves. We watch them build their self-esteem and find a purpose for their life." When an intern completes the program they receive a ServSafe certificate that gives them a good start on finding employment in the food industry.

For Katt, serving at Manna Cafe is a family affair. When she and her husband, Josh, moved to Clarksville they first were clients. At the time her father-in-law and brother-in-law worked for Manna. Then her husband Josh was hired, and she became involved in the Culinary Internship program. Her passion for baking evolved into helping with Manna Catering. She, too, shared the desire to give back to the community through working at Manna. "The kitchen is my 'happy place.' I love to pass on my knowledge to others," she explains.

When asked why she selected Katt as lead cook, Rita confidently says, "She's a leader. She is easy to work with and has good ideas on improving our program."

Each week the Manna kitchen staff and interns provide meals for more than 400 people on site at the Refuge and another 325 meals from the mobile cafe food truck at key locations in the community. "It's not easy work to put together nutritious meals geared toward healthy options. Some of our guests have special health needs so we try to offer a variety of foods," Rita shares. "Cooking takes a lot of love," Katt adds. "I love to see my cooking make someone smile. It's all done with passion and love."

When the temperatures drop

below freezing, Manna offers a warming center for those without permanent homes. Unfortunately, we cannot provide indoor accommodations for guests' pets. With the wind chill temps during the holidays dropping to below zero, the Humane Society of Clarksville-Montgomery County came to the rescue of several furry friends. Volunteers Retha and Sarah Chappell jumped into action and brought hard-shell kennels and doggie coats to ensure these pets would be warm through the frigid nights.

"We hear frequently that if you cannot afford to feed or fix your pet, you shouldn't have one ... but the Humane Society absolutely does *not* conform to this belief," explains Executive Director Amy Shaver. "Our pets just want to be with their people regardless of living situations. As a nonprofit, the Humane Society decided years ago that we needed to direct all of our resources into programs that help keep pets *with* their people and *out* of shelters. It's a win-win-win for pet owners, our pets, and the community!"


