# Finding Help, Finding Hope

When Laiza Marchal arrived at Manna Café, it was only after a journey of more than 5,000 miles from her home in Sao Paulo, Brazil, and a search for a place where she felt she belonged. Laiza is now one of Manna's family coaches working through the Our Chance TN initiative that helps families navigate the benefits cliff as they work toward achieving the American Dream.

College volleyball was her ticket out of Brazil. Laiza played at Laramie Community College in Wyoming and Lamar Community College in Colorado. She moved to Kentucky to be with family and then to Tennessee. After moving to Clarksville, Laiza and her two young sons found themselves in need of assistance. "We were having a hard time, but I didn't tell anyone," she explains.

Laiza's young family became clients of Manna's food distribution program and began receiving monthly food carts. They also heard about hot meals at the Refuge and attended them. In September Laiza and her boys had to leave their home. She didn't know where they would go, but she knew God would take care of them.

It was at a Thursday evening hot meal when Laiza opened up to the facility's assistant, Hunter, about her situation. Moved by her story, Hunter contacted Manna's COO, Ken Shipley. Mike, the Refuge manager, made her feel at home. "The Refuge was a place where I felt peace and love. There is definitely God here," she adds.

Laiza and Ken met on Monday to discuss options for her little family. At the time she was a delivery driver, and Ken offered her an opportunity to apply for an upcoming family coach position to help families bridge the benefit gap as they work to improve their lives. Manna found her another place to stay the same day. She was able to get her boys back in school.

Events moved along in October with a car accident that totaled Laiza's car. There went the delivery job, but thankfully nobody was hurt. The following week, Laiza interviewed for the family coach job and was selected. "I always wanted to work with people and help people," she explains. In November the Our Chance TN program began.

Laiza brings the unique perspective of sitting at both sides of the table. She understands the need for services, and now she can be part of the solution for other local families.

"It's definitely an honor and a blessing to be at Manna. They really care about people, and they want to help people. They have the heart for the community and the people. That's really good." Laiza also shares as she has become a part of the Manna team, she has a sense of belonging, something she hasn't felt before.

"I am learning about life. There are a lot of things to learn, but I'm up for the challenge," she proudly claims.

- 1,303 pounds of clothing (donated to other agencies)
- 8 nights of warming center services
  - shelter from frigid weather for 480 guests
- 101 hot showers for the homeless
