It's a partnership of farmers, food banks, and local agencies working together to ensure families have fresh, nutritious meals on their tables.



Through a federal grant program, Second Harvest of Tennessee has been able to support local farmers, ranchers, and producers while strengthening and growing sustainable partnerships in the food distribution community.

The Farm to Families program enlists minority and veteran small farmers who are dedicated to reducing food waste and feeding hungry people.

This program has helped Manna Cafe partner with area farmers in providing fresh produce for our clients.

Two amazing partners contributing to Manna's food distribution are Jackson Farms in Robertson County and 4 Ds Helping Hands Farm of Montgomery County.






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Summer of 2023 was the first growing season these farmers supplied Manna Cafe with fresh produce. Clients were treated to fresh beets, sweet corn, collard greens, turnips, and turnip greens. In fact, Manna received and distributed nearly 92,000 pounds of fresh produce from these farms alone.

Plans are being made for even more fresh deliveries in 2024.










